

Differences between High School & University Provision of ADA Mandated Accommodations

HIGH SCHOOL

High Schools are required to identify students with disabilities.

IEP is developed by a team of professionals & classes are arranged for the student.

Student accommodations are determined on a yearly basis.

Parental involvement is mandatory.

Students attend classes
5days/week
6 hours/day

Public School District is responsible for costs for provision of public education and accommodations.

Teachers may provide one to one feedback on daily classroom performance.

Parents and teachers may closely monitor student's study habits.

UNIVERSITY

Students are required to self-identify and provide copies of documentation of disability.

Students are responsible for developing own academic goals, as well as self-advocacy. The IEP is a K-12 document only.

Students must request accommodations each quarter.

Parental involvement is limited as students are recognized as adults.

Students spend 12 to 16 hours per week in class.

Students are responsible for paying University tuition & may be eligible to receive Vocational Rehabilitation financial assistance.

Professors expect students to meet syllabus requirements and are available for meetings with students during office hours.

Students are responsible for developing study habits that lead to their own success.
